Good morning FM Team,

I'd like to convey my appreciation for the role that Integrated Solid Waste (ISW) played in the early move out process of residence halls, which began March 16 and occurred over multiple weeks. The ISW crew came in on Saturdays and Sundays for three weeks in a row to assist with trash and recycling services from approximately 5,000 students moving out. They emptied recycling receptacles, cardboard bins, and dumpsters twice per day, so they would not overflow. The group also checked enclosures several times a day to collect large items such as refrigerators, couches, chairs, and other belongings that would not fit into a dumpster or should not go to the landfill. ISW coordinated with Surplus Property to drop off those larger items that students left behind. It took the entire crew to keep up with the trash, composting, and recycling during this time, enabling students to have a place to put their unwanted items and to finish moving out. Now the ISW crew is working on cleaning every recycling and compost bin on campus so the university is ready when students return.

Please join me in admiring the commitment and hard work that ISW delivers daily to the university community.
